#### **Days 1-5**

**Touch down** in the vibrant capital of Costa Rica, **San José**. Acclimatise to your new surroundings as you meet up with your local guides and take in the spectacular architecture and **buzzing markets** of the city. Try some 'comida tipica' - expect rice, beans and an array of tropical fruit and veg!

Head north to the stunning **Monteverde Cloud Forest**. Meet up with **expert conservationists** at the **Tropical Science Centre** who will give unique insights into their role in preserving this unique habitat, described by National Geographic as the '**jewel in the crown** of cloud forest reserves'.



Learn about the **Blue Flag** project run by local NGO **Waterkeeper**, which aims to reduce harmful plastics which threaten the turtles through community outreach and beach cleans. Meet a local initiative, **Bionic**, who will recycle the waste you collect into new products such as clothing and shoes.

And try your hand at **permaculture**, planting seeds and **nurturing saplings**, contributing to the protection and restoration of valuable ecosystems.

Soak in your surroundings - the beach is a great spot for a game of volleyball with your hosts, or even try your hand at some **salsa**!



At 1,400m above sea level, this special ecosystem is a **global biodiversity hotspot**. Hit the trails and keep your eyes (and ears!) peeled for howler monkeys, sloths, the resplendant Quetzal birds and a spectacular array of flora and fauna.

#### **Days 6-12**

**Travel south** by land and sea to the beautiful beaches of the **Nicoya Peninsula**. Meet an inspiring team of researchers from the Cirenas programme - join them on beach patrols searching for vulnerable **sea turtle** eggs and hatchlings, and help out back at the hatcheries.
