Why Greece?

Steeped in ancient history and surrounded by the beauty of turquoise Mediterranean waters, Greece has the largest coastline in Europe. This Global Action trip will take your students beyond a beach holiday destination for an inspirational Global Learning experience.

Ancient Greeks like Homer, Aristotle and Archimedes made important contributions to **politics, philosophy, mathematics, astronomy, and medicine**. Commonly known as the cradle of Western civilization, Greek myths and culture influenced the Roman Empire, and continue to influence modern culture today - think the Olympic games, Mamma Mia, The Hunger Games, Hercules, and Troy.

We've designed a special **cross-curricular** itinerary with local experts to see how Greece is working towards the UN's Sustainable Development Goals through conservation. This trip is the perfect European destination for anyone interested in **biology, geography, conservation, ancient Greece and architecture.**

- Conservation, Biodiversity, Ecosystems, Endangered Species
- Sustainable Development; Geology, Eco Tourism
- Ancient History, Art and Architecture

Useful facts

Geography: Greece is in the Mediterranean, in southern Europe. Greece has the longest coastline and is the southernmost country in Europe. The mainland has rugged mountains, forests, and lakes, but the country is well known for its spectacular beaches and islands.

Climate: June to August in Greece is hot, with average temperatures of $22^{\circ} - 35^{\circ}$ C; in October temperatures decrease to an average $17^{\circ} - 23^{\circ}$ C.

Languages: Greek is the national language of Greece however English is widely understood.

Culture: Greek people are very proud of their rich, vibrant culture and speak of their heritage with great passion. They are united by their traditions, religion, language, music, food, and wine. About 90% of the population is Greek orthodox.

Physical rating: This is a moderate trip; due to the work at the project and the heat in the summer, you will need the ability to walk with a daysack (3-4 hours).

Sample itinerary

Build Up Day

The day before departure, all team members will meet at the school. Your Global Action Leader will check your kit and run through health and safety briefings.

Day 1: Home – Preveza

Fly to **Preveza**, your base for the week. On arrival, transfer to your **eco-certified hotel** in the town centre, just a short walk from the waterfront. Settle in before heading out to explore Preveza's charming streets, lined with neoclassical architecture and bustling cafés.

In the evening, enjoy a **traditional Greek dinner**, sampling local delicacies such as **tzatziki**, **souvlaki**, **and fresh seafood**, while soaking in the relaxed atmosphere of this coastal town.

Day 2-3: Amvrakikos Gulf – marine biology research vessel

Head out into the **Amvrakikos Gulf**, an ecologically significant marine habitat, alongside a **Marine Biology professor from the University of Thessaly**. Board a research vessel and set off in search of **bottlenose dolphins**, observing their natural behaviour, tracking their movements, and assisting in **photo-identification** to contribute to conservation research.

Using a **hydrophone**, listen to the sounds dolphins use to communicate underwater, gaining insight into their social structures and interactions. The next day, take part in a **DNA sampling project**, an advanced technique used to monitor marine mammal populations without direct observation.



Lunch is served **on board**, just as marine researchers experience in the field. After returning to shore, learn about **traditional fishing techniques** and the sustainable harvesting of **Greek caviar**. Evenings are filled with culture—dine in **local tavernas**, listen to **live Greek music**, and even try your hand at **traditional Greek dancing**.

Day 4: Amvrakikos Wetlands

Venture into the **Amvrakikos Wetlands**, one of Greece's most important ecosystems, home to rare and migratory bird species. Led by an **ornithologist**, observe **Dalmatian pelicans**, flamingos, and other wildlife, learning about their habitat and conservation challenges.





Later, visit a **local environmental education centre** for an engaging discussion on biodiversity and marine conservation. The day concludes with a **beach clean-up at Monolithi Beach**, Europe's longest beach, where you'll take part in a hands-on environmental project to help protect the coastal ecosystem.



Back in Preveza, embark on a **guided walking tour**, discovering the town's Venetian history and landmarks such as the **Castle of Pantokratoras**. A fun **scavenger hunt** will reveal hidden stories about the town's past.

Day 5-6: Exploring History

Travel back in time with a **guided tour of Nikopolis**, an ancient city founded by **Emperor Octavian** after his victory at the Battle of Actium. Explore the **Roman theatre**, **baths**, **and city ruins**, then visit the **Archaeological Museum of Nikopolis**, home to fascinating artifacts from ancient Greece and Rome.



Afterwards, take part in a **Greek cooking class**, where you'll learn to prepare authentic dishes using fresh, local ingredients. Enjoy your homemade meal while discussing the rich culinary traditions of Greece.



The adventure continues with a visit to the **Nekromanteion of Acheron**, an ancient temple believed to be a **gateway to the underworld**. This mystical site was once used for necromantic rituals dedicated to Hades and Persephone.

From here, travel to **Glyki village** for a traditional lunch before setting off on a cooling **river trek through Acheron Canyon**. Walk through clear, turquoise waters, passing towering cliffs and hidden caves as you follow the legendary **path of the souls to the underworld**.

Day 7: Exploring the Ionian Islands

Board a private cruise from **Lefkada**, setting sail across the **Ionian Sea**. Stop at **Porto Katsiki** and **Egremni Beach**, two of the most breathtaking beaches in Greece, where you can swim in crystal-clear turquoise waters.

Continue to **Fiskardo**, a Venetian-style village on Kefalonia, known for its picturesque harbour and traditional architecture. From there, sail to **Ithaca**, **legendary home of Odysseus**, where you'll explore the landscapes that inspired **Homer's epic tales**.



After a day of island-hopping, return to the mainland for a final relaxing evening enjoying Greek hospitality.

Day 8: Head Home

On your final morning, enjoy a **leisurely breakfast**. Reflect on your unique adventure in a Global Learning Review, before transferring to **Preveza International Airport** for your flight home. Leave this beautiful country, with lasting memories of your **marine research**, conservation efforts, and cultural discoveries, along with a deeper understanding of environmental sustainability and Greek heritage.

You will arrive back home with memories to last a lifetime, and the ASDAN Universities Award!
