

Why Greece?

Steeped in ancient history and surrounded by the beauty of turquoise Mediterranean waters, Greece has the largest coastline in Europe. This Global Action trip will take your students beyond a beach holiday destination for an inspirational Global Learning experience.

Ancient Greeks like Homer, Aristotle and Archimedes made important contributions to **politics, philosophy, mathematics, astronomy, and medicine**. Commonly known as the cradle of Western civilization, Greek myths and culture influenced the Roman Empire, and continue to influence modern culture today - think the Olympic games, Mamma Mia, The Hunger Games, Hercules, and Troy.

We've designed a special **cross-curricular** itinerary with local experts to see how Greece is working towards the UN's Sustainable Development Goals through conservation, and refugee support. This trip is the perfect European destination for anyone interested in **biology**, **geography**, **conservation**, **politics**, **ancient Greece and architecture**.

Useful facts

Geography: Greece is in the Mediterranean, in southern Europe. Greece has the longest coastline and is the southernmost country in Europe. The mainland has rugged mountains, forests, and lakes, but the country is well known for its spectacular beaches and islands.

Climate: June to August Greece is hot, with average temperatures of $22^{\circ} - 35^{\circ}$ C, in October temperatures decrease to an average $17^{\circ} - 23^{\circ}$ C.

Languages: Greek is the national language of Greece however English is widely understood.

Culture: Greek people are very proud of their rich, vibrant culture and speak of their heritage with great passion. They are united by their traditions, religion, language, music, food, and wine. About 90% of the population is Greek orthodox.

Physical rating: This is a moderate trip; due to the work at the project and the heat in the summer, you will need the ability to walk with a daysack (3-4 hours).

Accommodation: You will be staying in a hotel while in Athens and in the Peloponnese.

Sample itinerary

Build Up Day

The day before departure, all team members will meet at the school. Your Global Action Leader will check your kit and run through health and safety briefings.

Days 1: Home – Athens

Your exciting adventure begins, as you fly to the capital of Greece, Athens. On arrival, you will be met by your guide, who will be a **specialist in ecology**, and make your way to your hotel in Glyfada – the cosmopolitan Riviera of Athens.

Spend the evening down by the marina, and enjoy a traditional meal (local specialities often include tzatziki, moussaka and a favourite fast food, the mouth-watering Souvlaki) while listening to live Greek music, before heading back to your hotel for a good sleep!



Day 2: Athens - Sea turtle rescue centre



You'll start your second day with a short stroll down to the beach, where you will visit the **Archelon Sea Turtle Rescue Centre**, a rehab facility for sea turtles, and get the opportunity to see their conservation work first-hand. The Rescue Centre's main functions are to receive, treat and rehabilitate injured and sick sea turtles, then release them back to the wild - all while raising public awareness of their work and the threats these incredible animals face.

Nature lovers and keen biologists will be in their element while learning the intricacies of turtle ecology and behaviour, in preparation for your **turtle conservation project** later in your trip.

Days 3 – 6: Turtle Conservation Protection Project – Peloponnese Peninsula

Today you will travel to beautiful Neapolis in the **Peloponnese Peninsula**. Travelling along the E65 from Athens you will cross the Corinth Canal. Built in 1881, the canal was dug through the isthmus at sea level and has no locks. From there you will head into the mountains of the Peloponnese before dropping down to the stunning Neapolis bay, on the Elafonisos Straight.

Today you will meet the passionate volunteers who run the NGO Tulipa Gulimi which promotes conservation of flora, fauna, and Greek culture in the Southern Peloponnese. The group will learn about sea turtle biology, conservation, threat to turtles and take part in discussions around sustainable tourism which link to several of the UN's Sustainable Development Goals.





You will start with an introduction to the project and learn why their conservation efforts are critical for the protection of the IUCN Red List 'vulnerable' Loggerhead turtle, as well as getting the opportunity to ask loads of questions to the experts. The group will see first-hand what is being done to protect Loggerhead turtles by NGOs such as Tulipa Gulimi. Each day you will undertake guided beach patrols, looking out for new turtle nests and monitoring existing nests.

Tulipa Gulimi monitor the costal habitats and raise public awareness of the turtles and the importance of protecting the nesting beaches. There are several nesting beaches in the region meaning a large area for the NGO to monitor. You will provide them with vital support as they work to increase the chances of survival for Loggerhead turtles returning to Greece each summer. Be prepared for early starts (6am) or early evening patrols. Packed breakfasts will be provided.

Depending on the time of year (Mid-May to August is nesting season and the end of July to October is hatching season), you will get stuck into some of the following activities:

- looking for adult turtle tracks, locating nests, enclose and mark them
- locate baby turtle tracks and nests, relocate any threatened nests
- marking of hatching nests and dealing with any hatchlings that are still on the beach
- shading nests to protect the hatchlings from disorientation
- collection of reeds to construct the protection of the nest, and making wooden constructions such as boxes for injured turtles
- beach cleans







During the hottest part of the day (midday to 3pm) we have scheduled a variety of activities. You will visit Tulipa Gulimi's recently opened Wildlife Rescue First Aid and Environmental Information Centre just outside Neapolis. Here, you can learn about the extraordinary conservation efforts of this NGO throughout the Peloponnese.

Another afternoon will include exploring the extraordinary Kastania Cave, containing some of the best examples of rare stalactites and stalagmites in Europe, estimated to be around 3 million years old!

Lastly, on an evening when the stars are most visible under a clear sky, Yiannis and local astronomers will lead a session combining Greek mythology and astrology. There will be some downtime during the hottest parts of the day before and after lunch. Your Global Action Leader and local guide will arrange activities such as team building games and quizzes. There will also be the opportunity to enjoy the blue flag beach just across the road from your hotel. You will also have some free time to relax on the stunning beaches, and cool off with a paddle.

During the project, you can enjoy interactive talks from experts on the local wildlife, and the fascinating underwater city of Pavlopetri, which is 5,000 years old, making it the oldest submerged city known in the world. Pavlopetri is unique in having an almost complete town plan, including streets, buildings, and tombs.

Day 7: Athens – NGO Shedia and the Parthenon

Then it will be time to return to Athens for the final part of your trip. Your private coach will pick you up, and take you to your central Athens hotel.

Explore the oldest part of this fascinating city. Known as the 'neighbourhood of the Gods', Plaka is in the shadow of the world-famous Acropolis. With its cobbled streets and market stalls, Plaka is the perfect place to get to know your surroundings, learn about the history of Athens and practice the odd few Greek words (it is handy that you can use the same word, "yassou", for hello and goodbye!).

You'll meet with the NGO Shedia, home to the country's street paper. Shedia is an inspiring non-profit organisation providing work and building confidence for people who are homeless, living in poverty, unable to find employment or otherwise vulnerable and underprivileged. You will see how it supports, reduces poverty, and empowers people through its social projects.





After enjoying a delicious lunch with the NGO, you'll take part in an 'Invisible Athens tour' which introduces some of the most important social and solidarity institutions of the Greek capital, as well as exploring state social and grassroots movements fighting against poverty and social exclusion.

You will also have a guided tour of the ancient citadel of the Acropolis, one of many UNESCO World Heritage Sites in the country. Containing the remains of several ancient buildings of great architectural and historic significance, the most famous being the Parthenon, the Acropolis is arguably the most striking and complete ancient Greek monumental complete complex that still exists.

Day 8: Athens - Home

Today you say goodbye and travel back to Athens airport for your flight home. You can reflect on your unique adventure in a Global Learning Review: from helping in sea turtle conservation, exploring mesmerising ancient ruins, to learning about the environmental and social organisations working towards a sustainable future in modern Greece.

You will arrive back home with memories to last a lifetime, and the ASDAN Universities Award!

Organisations we support in Greece

SHEDIA is an Urban non-profit organisation established in early 2010 to provide support to the most vulnerable members of society who are experiencing homelessness and social exclusion, giving them tools to support themselves and improve their personal, social and economic well-being.

TULIPA GOULIMI named after a local tulip this association of volunteers aims to protect wildlife of all kinds in the southernmost area of the Peloponnese. They focus on the Loggerhead Sea turtle nesting zones each summer in collaboration with Archelon. Daily patrols protect hundreds of nesting sites.






